


How to view your feedback on “Turnitin”

“Turnitin” is a plagiarism software that will let your professor know if there is plagiarism (matching text) in your assignment. “Turnitin” also checks for minor grammatical errors.

If you resubmit your assignment, you will not be able to view it in “Turnitin.”

1. Before you submit your assignment, check the box next to “I agree to the tool’s End-Under License Agreement.”

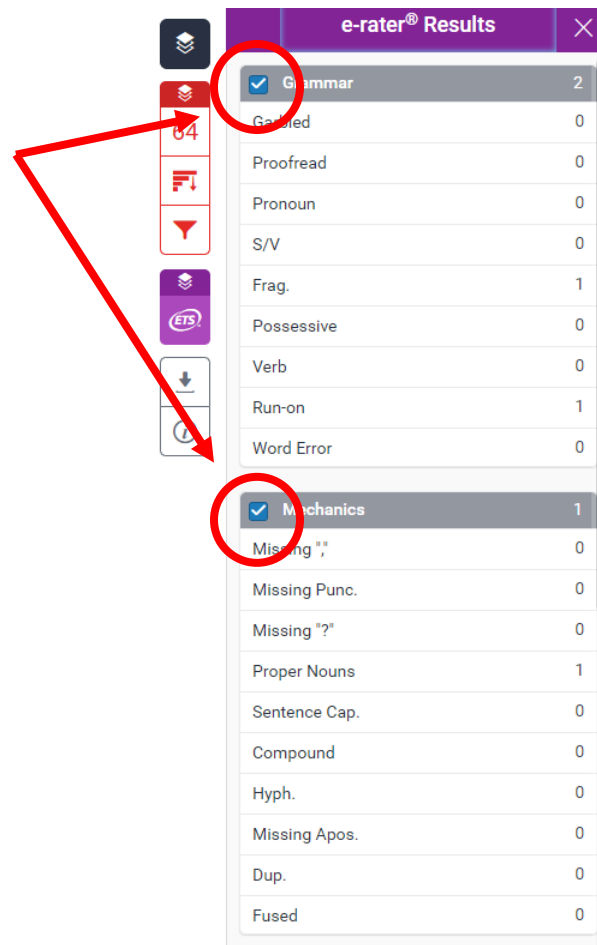

3. To view grammatical errors, all of the boxes need to be checked.



What each Icon means:



Active Layer – Click to open the window to see similarity e-rater or both.



Percent of Match – Some of this may be material in quotes.



Open all sources that match.



Filter – Exclude quotes, bibliography, words and percentages and apply to calculate a new match percentage.



E-rater – Results will show all suggested changes for spelling, grammar, usage, mechanics and style.



Download – Current view, digital receipt or originally submitted file.



Submission information – Submission date, word count, page numbers and more.

4. Grammatical errors will be highlighted in purple, and matching text will be highlighted in red.
