Thank you for your interest in the Associate Degree Nursing (RN) program at New River Community College! Please note that admission to the A.D.N. program is competitive entry consisting of TEAS scores, G.P.A.'s, and pre-nursing classes. Information session dates and other pertinent information will be available online at www.nr.edu/nursing. You **MUST** attend a meeting and take the TEAS at NRCC for your folder to be reviewed. If using last year TEAS or scores from another location please contact Nursing Admission Advisor, Kimberly Johnston. Your folder must be complete by March 31 of the selection year in order for possible selection. Any requirement changes will be noted online. You will need to complete the following requirements to be eligible:

- ___ application to the program and to the college
- ___ *high school transcript or satisfactory completion of a GED
- ___ *official college transcript(s)
- ___ one unit of high school chemistry or equivalent (must be enrolled in college equivalent)
- ___ one unit of high school biology (including lab) or equivalent (must be enrolled)
- ___ completion of the NRCC placement test for reading, writing at the ENG 111 level
- ___ completion of the NRCC placement test for math (MTH 3 placement test or college math course must have been taken during the past year- March to March)
- ___ college students must be in good standing and have a curricular 2.5 GPA or higher
- ___ recent high school students under option one must have high school GPA 3.0 or curricular GPA in 12 or more college credits and resubmit high school transcripts upon graduation
- ___ TEAS
- ___ attend general information session

These requirements must be met by March 31 or you will be moved to the following selection year. It is your responsibility to ensure that your folder is complete and your mailing address and phone number are correct on the Student Information System (PeopleSoft).
