



Middle College is a free college entrance program for young adults who do not have a high school diploma and want to go to New River Community College to further their education. Students also take a career development course that assists them in making career decisions, completing the college admissions and financial aid processes, and directly transitioning into one of New River Community College's certificate, diploma, or associate degree programs.

Middle College students typically begin their college program of study at the next semester after entrance into Middle College. Middle College has open enrollment, so students can join anytime. Academic tutoring and career counseling are also available.

**ADULT HIGH SCHOOL**

A computer assisted instructional method to help individuals earn a high school diploma from area participating high schools

The New River Community College Adult High School Program is designed for individuals who are at least 18 years old, lack credits toward a high school diploma, have time to invest in their education, and have transportation to a local adult learning center or a computer with a high speed Internet connection. To be a participant, students must obtain a copy of their high school transcript. At the completion of their program, students must take WorkKeys Assessments in reading for information, locating information, and applied mathematics to earn a Career Readiness Certificate. **FOSTER YOUTH COLLEGE BRIDGE PROGRAM**

The Foster Youth College Bridge Program is a cooperative program between New River Community College and local Departments of Social Services for youth who are or have been in Foster Care between the ages of 13 and 24 to assist them in successfully transitioning to a college program of study at New River Community College. Providing supportive, mentoring, and retention services for completion of their college program of study, the Foster Youth College Bridge Program helps youth achieve self-sufficiency as they transition to adulthood. An after-school program is available to school-aged youth to help them eventually bridge into New River Community College. A morning and evening program are available to older youth who are no longer receiving services from area public schools.
