The following examples illustrate how to cite various sources using APA Documentation. Full citations will appear alphabetically on the Reference List page of your paper. In-text citations will refer to this page and will include the author's name followed by the publication date in parenthesis. Refer to the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association, 6th ed. (2010) for more detailed entries. The library has copies of this book on reserve and in the circulation collection.

Journal Article from database

(Include doi:, or URL. There is no period at the end of a reference citation ending with a doi number or URL)
