Grading

A. Journals

At the beginning of each section of the course, students will create a Microsoft Word document with the titles of the compositions that we will be listening to from the list posted in Canvas. *During class*, students will take notes of their reactions and observations while listening to different compositions. *After each class*, while the memory of the music is still present, just type a complete paragraph with your reactions to the works we listened to. At the end of the section, just submit your journal through Canvas. Please refer to the Canvas Journal Rubric for expectations.

B. Playlists

This is the students' opportunity to explore music and compile their own playlist from each music period that we will be covering in class. The source of music for the playlists is Alexander Street, which provides access to over 10 million recordings! Instructions and grading rubric are posted in Canvas. Of course, you can also use Alexander Street to access other music as well!

C. Discussion Forums

Five forums designed to delight, intrigue and reflect will provide the opportunity for a musical "commercial break" from what is covered in class.

D. In-class/Inbox Assignments

Throughout the semester, we will be touching on topics in class that I will ask students to explore further. These assignments, due at the beginning of the next class, require a simple typed paragraph. I will also send assignments through the inbox that will take you to fascinating music topics that will open further one's musical horizons.

Since every student has different interests, I do not expect everyone to respond to each assignment. The important thing is to complete 15 assignments by the end of the semester.

E. Exams

There will be three exams based on the material covered in each section of the course. Practice quizzes in Canvas provide unlimited opportunity for exam preparation.
