Preference is given to applicants who are residents of NRCC's service region (Floyd, Giles, Montgomery, and Pulaski Counties and the City of Radford).

Priority is given to students who receive the highest TEAS scores. TEAS scores are valid for two years.) Attendance at a PN general information session Cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher for former PN students applying for readmission
